Escape
behaviors
typically occur
when a child
wants to avoid
or "escape"
doing something.



Attention—seeking behavior occurs when a child desires feedback or a response from you — either positive or negative.



A child may engage in certain behaviors because they are looking to gain access to something tangible like a cookie or a toy.



Sensory
stimulation
occurs when a
child wants to
experience a
pleasant sensation
or replace
discomfort.

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Understanding why a child is showing certain behaviors is the most important part of helping them. Behaviors are how a developing child shows how they are feeling internally or reacting to the external environment.
